### **TB2- Urban Adventures Malbec Trail of Palermo**

Then, your wine tour takes you to a wine cellar for your own personal tasting bar. A local wine expert will lead the tasting session and teach you everything you wanted to know about Argentine wine, from its culture and origins, to how it's cultivated, processed, and bottled. As you take in your wine lesson, you will also have the opportunity to taste many of the different wines that Argentina has to offer, because you can't be an expert without putting those taste buds to work! You'll also learn how to drink Argentina's famous Malbec like the locals do, because #localsknow, after all. After the wine tasting session, your Buenos Aires tour moves onto one of Palermo's best local bars, where you can taste a real fernet. Hopefully you'll discover why this bitter digestif is so widely consumed by local Argentinians. The two circuits (blue/red and green) take in key landmarks such as the Casa Rosada, the National Congress, the Colón Theatre, the Metropolitan Cathedral, the Caminito, the Bombonera stadium and River Plate's stadium in Nuñez. Synchronised audioguides provide information about the history and significance of each site in ten languages. Traditional and comprehensive city tour will allow you to get an idea of the historical, architectural and demographic characteristics of the cosmopolitan City of Buenos Aires. The tour includes 24 stops which are great tourist points in the City of Buenos Aires. ### **TB7 – Context Private Walking Tour: Tango, Beyond the Dance**

Tues/Wed, 11 AM, Duration 3 hrs, \$275.00

The origins of Tango will be discussed as we visit the few remaining colorful 'conventillos' - large tenement houses offering very small rooms. Conventillos once housed newcomers from Italy, Spain, Germany and Russia but also from Africa and the Caribbean as well as some 'porte os' who could not afford a rent in more respectable parts of town. . In order to have a glimpse into the bohemian life of La Boca, which at the turn of the centuries was home to blue-collar workers, musicians, prostitutes, thieves, socialists, anarchists and artists, we may visit the Museum of Benito Quinquela Martín, a central figure of the artistic life in this lower class district, origin to a dance considered by the aristocracy to be vulgar. We will follow this trail and leave La Boca heading to Microcentro, to a glorious cafe by day and milonga by night: La Confitería Ideal. From here we will then have a chance to visit a shop with hand-made tango shoes, after Astor Piazzolla revolutionized the music and reintroduced it into the popular culture. Our next stop will be the Academy and Museum of Tango, where objects related to the history of this dance and culture are presented chronologically. Our walk will finish in Cafe Tortoni, the elegant cafe beloved among writers and politicians, t's a chance to enjoy a cup of coffee with a churro con dulce de leche and to ask your docent about the popular milongas, , gear shops and anything you might need to experience Tango in Buenos Aires on your own.

### **TB8 – Urban Adventures Tango, Tango, Tango!**

Your tango tour will meet at an iconic French-style coffee house on Avenida de Mayo, where we'll learn about the origins and history of tango (and discover one of the most traditional bars in the city). From there, we'll go through the tango tradition , and yes, even a few secret codes! , over a drink, and you'll prepare to immerse yourself in the world of the milongueros (tango dancers). Then, once you're ready, we'll head toward a milonga tango hall in town, a dance hall where locals go to sharpen up their skills (and maybe you'll be inspired to try some tango steps yourself!). We'll finish our tango tour there, where you can take a seat, grab a drink, and watch Argentinian life unfold as the night goes on. Inclusions: English and Spanish-speaking local guide/expert tango dancer, a drink. Here we will try to trace the importance of various display possibilities, onstage as well as in an urban context in addition to public issues such as education, hygiene and infrastructure and their visual presence within the urban tissue. We will then commute to the most elegant districts of Buenos Aires; Recoleta and Retiro. As we stroll along the Avenida Alvear, through Plaza Pellegrini and Plaza San Martín, we will be able to admire the private palaces of the Argentine society representing the greatest affinity to the once so demanded 'Parisian style'. Lastly, our walk will lead us to an exquisite example of industrial architecture: the stunning Retiro Train Station.

What will emerge as we head to the Parque Lezama is a specific political dynamic which facilitated the development of socialist and anarchist ideas among the dwellers.
